Queen's Beach Indoor Bowls Club Inc. Celebrated its 50th. Anniversary on February 18th The club commenced in 1963.

The Club formed part of the Redcliffe Association in 1969

Members and invited guests had a very enjoyable night, playing two games of bowls, after which followed a delicious supper.

Patron Vern Langsdorf, a member of the Club for forty four years, Vern also held the position of President for some 20 yrs. was given the privilege of cutting the Anniversary cake. A history of the Club had been compiled, and provided to those present with some interesting items of the past.

The club has played in the same venue for all its fifty years even though the adjacent church which owns the hall has had different managements. Firstly the Methodist Church which became the Uniting Church and when that moved to a new location in 1998 the property was bought by the Samoan 7th Day Adventist Church, the trustees of which allowed the club to remain and to rent the hall. All the rental fees have been low for which the club has been grateful.

Membership of the club has varied over the years. Records show that in 1997 our membership was 84, our highest ever. Sadly today our membership is 26.

Playing fees were regretfully raised from sixpence to one shilling in January 1964 and later in the year at the AGM to two shillings in 1975. Membership fees were one dollar and playing fees on Monday nights were thirty cents and Thursday afternoons twenty cents.

In 2007 John Norton became President and in 2009 Jen Schumacher was elected President. In 2011 John again took on the position as President, a position he still holds. Over the years there have been 10 secretaries, with the current one, Marie Langsdorf holding the position since 2007 after resigning from the position of treasurer, a position she held from 1997. There have been 13 treasurers; the current one is Lois Norton who took on the position in 2007.

Our club is functioning well and even though our membership is only 26, we enjoy the friendship that is displayed on our Monday nights and Thursday afternoons. We still run some competitions and look forward to the 1st Monday and 1st Thursday of each month when we socialise with supper and afternoon tea after our trophy games. We encourage our members to participate in the Redcliffe Association games because without support from local and outside clubs it is struggling to keep active. Our yearly visitor's night is looked forward to, as is our Christmas dinner.

As a memento of the occasion, everyone present was presented with a crystal glass, suitably engraved, and a copy of the Clubs history.

The Club plays at the church hall, cnr.Griffith Rd. & Prince Edward Pde. Scarborough on Monday nights & Thursday Afternoon, and will welcome new members at any time. For further information please phone John Norton 32044809 or Marie Langsdorf 32037752.
