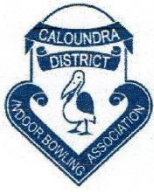
I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support during the past twelve months.

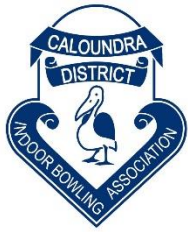
Brisbane

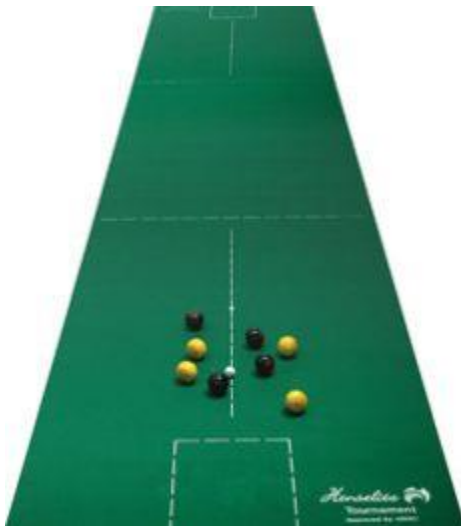
